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ABSTRACT: The abstract should consist of a single paragraph containing at least 100 and at most 250 words. The format should be justified, Times New Roman, 14 points. There should be a one-line space before the abstract.

Keywords: A minimum of 3 and a maximum of 6 keywords should be provided. There should be no space before or after "Keywords."

1. FIRST MAIN TITLE

1.1. First Subheading

The paper should be prepared in a single-column format, with a line spacing of 1.5 for the entire text (1.0 in tables). The font size should be 14 points for the paper title and author names, and 14 points for the remaining sections. The page size should be A4 (21 cm x 29.7 cm), with margins of 3 cm from the top, bottom, and sides.

There should be no paragraph indentation in the first paragraph following the paper title. Subsequent paragraphs should have a 1.25 cm indentation. After main headings, there should be a one-line space.

1.1.1. Second subheading

In the main title, all words should be written in uppercase, in the first subheading, each word should begin with a capital letter, and in the second subheading, only the first word should begin with a capital letter. When starting a new section, there should be a one-line space between the previous paragraph and the heading. There should be no space between paragraphs. All paragraphs should begin with a 1.25 cm indentation.

Tables should be prepared in a format similar to the example below, with the title placed above the table. There should be a one-line space between the table and the paragraphs above and below it. The line spacing in the table should be 1.

Figures should be prepared in a format similar to the example below, with the title placed below the figure. There should be a one-line space between the figure and the paragraphs above and below it.

The paper should include the sections "INTRODUCTION," "MATERIALS AND METHODS," "RESULTS AND DISCUSSION," "CONCLUSIONS," and "REFERENCES."

In the text, publications with 1-2 authors should be cited as '...Özfırat (2010)...' or '...(Özfırat and Eyüboğlu, 2010).' Publications with more than two authors should be cited as '...Özfırat et al. (2010)...' or '...(Özfırat et al., 2010).'
